# • PLEASE REMEMBER OUR TURF TIPS •

## **MOWING** – Raise your mower to the highest setting – the taller the grass

- the deeper the roots will go
- the less weeds there will be
- the more green you will see
- it keeps the crown of the plant shaded and healthy
- Only take off 1/3 of the grass plant when you mow. Ex grass is 4" don't take more than 1.5" off when you mow.

#### WHEN – To help reduce the stress on the plant

- Mow when grass is dry to avoid clumping
- During the cooler part of the day morning or late afternoon

#### BLADES – Always keep your mower blades sharp

- Dull blades will tear the grass not cut it.
- Ragged edges are an invitation for disease

# **GRASS CLIPPINGS** – Leave the grass clippings

- They add nutrients back into the soil
- They DO NOT add to thatch
- Don't use them as mulch because of weed control that may have been applied
